## **Cotuit Fire District**

The **Prudential Committee** reports that in a public meeting on April 25, ICON Architecture presented its findings regarding the costs of renovating or demolishing the Cotuit School building. ICON concluded that demolishing the building and returning the site to nature would cost \$1.86 million. Alternatively, necessary renovations to restore the building for possible use as a community/senior center total \$14.29 million. A partial renovation that focused on recreational uses would cost \$11.13 million. ICON's presentation and report are available on the Cotuit Fire District website. Did you know the **Cotuit Water Department** maintains over 53 miles of water mains to deliver safe drinking water to 2,329 service connections? These pipes run through 99% of the District, from Oregon Beach at the end of Main Street to areas north of Route 28. The system includes mains ranging from 4" to 12" in diameter, branching into smaller pipes that serve individual homes. Some sections date back to the department's founding in 1936, when cement-lined cast iron was used. Today's pipes are cement-lined ductile iron, which is both stronger and lighter. As part of the department's ongoing infrastructure maintenance, aging pipes are replaced as needed and as funding permits. Last fall, a 700-foot stretch along the east side of Lewis Pond Road was upgraded at a cost of \$200,000. This project was competitively bid and contracted to ensure cost-effectiveness and quality.
