

Hi neighbors. As the cooler air and vibrant autumn colors creep in, I too am thankful for Octobers. And as things around the village slow down, take a moment to savor all the season has to offer. But before you slow down too much, take some time to learn about a few projects affecting villagers.

In 2017, discussion began on possible Memorial Park improvements. The project was paused during the pandemic, but now draft plans are again being discussed. To provide information and an opportunity for input prior to the adoption of a final plan, the Civic Association will hold a community meeting on Tuesday October 21, 7 p.m. at Freedom Hall.

Does Main Street Cotuit sometimes feel like the Indy 500? To slow traffic and improve pedestrian safety, a **raised crosswalk** adjacent to the library has been proposed, and the Town is seeking comment. To express an opinion, email seth.burdick@town.barnstable.ma.us.

The 1783 Ebenezer Crocker Jr. house, which sits at the corner of Putnam Avenue and Old Shore Road overlooking the bay, is Cotuit's oldest house and rich in its history.

The Cape Cod Commission will review a proposal to demolish the house's ells and move the main structure from its present site. If the proposal is accepted, the house will lose its historic additions, one of which was the first post office in Cotuit Port, as well as its listing on the National Register of Historic Places.

The **Board of Water Commissioners** (BOWC) thanks everyone who attended the Wastewater Workshop in August. The panel of experts shared updates on Barnstable's Comprehensive Wastewater Management Plan, explored innovative septic technologies, and discussed strategies to protect Cotuit's ponds, bays, and drinking water. Community engagement is key as plans move forward, and your participation is appreciated. If you weren't able to join, a full recording is available at csc.wistia.com/medias/0npx8a8law.

The BOWC also reminds residents that Cape Cod and the Islands remain under Level II Severe Drought Conditions. Please help conserve water by limiting outdoor use to two days per week and avoiding non-essential water usage between 5 a.m. and 8 p.m. Together, we can protect our water resources for the whole community.

October is Fire Safety Month, and **Cotuit Fire Department** reminds us that small steps can make a big difference in protecting your home and loved ones. Take time to test your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms, review your family's fire escape plan, and make sure everyone knows two ways out of every room. Keep matches and lighters out of children's reach, and never leave cooking unattended.

Construction on the new fire station is anticipated to begin next month, marking a major step forward in improving our facilities and ensuring we can better serve the Cotuit community for generations to come.
